#### **ABOUT THE FESTIVAL**

The Zürcher Theater Spektakel was founded in the 1980s by Zurich's independent theatre and circus scene and has been organized by the City of Zurich for over 40 years. From the beginning, it has focused on presenting contemporary, international theatre, dance, performance, and circus.

Today, it is one of Europe's leading festivals for contemporary performing arts and the largest of its kind in Switzerland.

The festival takes place for 18 days each August in a lakeside park. Most venues are temporary structures, complemented by existing spaces like the alternative cultural center Rote Fabrik and collaborations with institutions across the city. The program ranges from major international productions to smaller-scale works and a platform for emerging artists.

#### FESTIVAL CENTER - TREEHOUSE

Located on the upper floor of the Zentral building at the heart of the festival site, this space is designed for artists, professionals, and the festival team to meet, exchange, work – and relax. During the day, it is open for co-working and retreat; from 9 pm, local artists host tea, tarot, and conversations.

#### **ZURICH - KEY FACTS**

- Largest Swiss city, ~400,000 residents (over 1 million with suburbs) from Switzerland and around the world
- Diverse, multilingual, and generally open-minded
- Local language is Swiss German, almost everybody speaks English and some French
- Locals may seem reserved at first, but are usually friendly and helpful

#### **GETTING AROUND**

**Public transport** Safe, fast, and reliable. Use Google Maps or the ZVV app. Service ends around 0:30 on weekdays; on weekends, night buses/trains run later. You can also reach the festival site by boat — info here.

**Bicycles** Züri rollt offers free daily rentals (ID deposit, CHF 10 late fee). <u>Publibike</u> e-bikes are available at stations citywide.

#### **WEATHER & CLOTHING**

Late summer temperatures range from 18–30 °C by day, but evenings at the lake can be cool (12–15 °C). Rain and storms are common. Bring a sweater/jacket and rain protection even on sunny days.

#### **MONEY**

**Currency** Swiss Franc (CHF). Cards widely accepted. Euros are sometimes accepted but with poor exchange rates and change in CHF.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

- If you have special access needs, please get in touch with the festival team
- The city is mostly flat with wide curbs; cobblestones and steps in older areas can be a barrier
- Most accessible toilets use the Eurokey system; keys available at many venues
- Public transport partly step-free see ZVV for details
- **Safer Space** Next to main entrance of the festival site, ambulance unit wheelchair accessible, quiet, comfortable seating. Awareness team on site: 077 279 00 94. More info here.

#### **LEISURE & SWIMMING**

Zurich's old town, lakeside, and riverside are perfect for walks. See shared Google Map for recommended spots.

**Swimming** Lake Zurich and the river are clean and popular for swimming — including at the festival site (Saffa Island, free).

**Excursions** Boat trip on Lake Zurich [<u>info</u>], or hike up Uetliberg for city views.

**Culture** Theaters are closed in August, but there are some amazing museums to visit: Löwenbräukunst (Kunsthalle, Migros Museum, Luma Westbau), Kunsthaus, Museum Rietberg, Haus Konstruktiv, Cabaret Voltaire, plus <u>alternative art</u> venues.

#### **FOOD & DRINKS**

Eating out can be pricey. Coop & Migros supermarkets are cheaper (closed on Sundays). Tap water is excellent and free at fountains and at water stations on the festival site.

**On site** Food stalls and Restaurant Ziegel (Rote Fabrik) — note: many close after performances. See <u>shared Google Map</u> for late-night restaurants.

**Queer spaces** Regenbogenhaus, Gleis, Kweer Bar, Heaven. Many queer-friendly events at Zentralwäscherei, Rote Fabrik, Feministisches Streikhaus. Ask the artist care team for more tips.
